Bills That Changed Oklahoma's Retirement Systems

Bill / Year	Role	Systems	Effect
SB 1894 <i>2006</i>	Principal Author	TRS, OPERS, URSJJ / Pension legislation generally	Required actuarial analysis and a two-session process for fiscal retirement legislation; required a funding provision for measures with fiscal impact.
HB 2132 <i>2011</i>	Recorded Senate Coauthor; Senate Presenter	All six statewide systems	Required a funding source for permanent COLAs, preventing the actuarial cost from being left to the retirement systems.
SB 377 <i>2011</i>	Principal Senate Author	TRS	Raised the retirement age for new teachers and changed Rule-of-90 eligibility for new entrants.
SB 794 <i>2011</i>	Principal Senate Author	OPERS	Changed retirement ages for new OPERS entrants and aligned future elected-official benefit formulas more closely with other employees.
HB 1010 <i>2011</i>	Principal Senate Autho	URSJJ	Raised the normal retirement age for newly entering justices and judges.
HB 2078 <i>2013</i>	Principal Senate Author	Firefighters	Raised service and age requirements for new hires, increased employee and employer contribution rates, and modified vesting and DROP rules.
HB 2630 <i>2014</i>	Recorded Senate Coauthor	OPERS / Pathfinder	Placed most new state employees hired on or after November 1, 2015, in a defined-contribution plan rather than the OPERS defined-benefit plan.
