

OKLAHOMA PUBLIC WORKERS DESERVE THE FULL RECORD

Oklahoma's public workers keep our communities safe, our classrooms staffed, and our state running. We earn our retirement with a promise that should be kept.

Mike Mazzei's legislative record shows a pattern of making that promise weaker:

-  **WORK LONGER.**
He supported raising the retirement age for new teachers.
-  **WAIT LONGER.**
He helped make cost-of-living adjustments (COLAs) harder to get for retirees.
-  **PAY MORE.**
Pushed for increased employee contribution rates for new firefighter hires.
-  **LESS SECURITY.**
He supported moving many new state employees away from a traditional pension and toward less secure plans.



KEY FACTS



SB 377 (2011)

Raised the normal retirement age for new teachers from 62 to 65.



HB 2132 (2011)

Required a separate funding source for future COLAs, making them harder to approve.



HB 2630 (2014)

Placed many new state employees into OPERS Pathfinder—a defined-contribution plan rather than the traditional defined-benefit pension.



Other Measures (2011–2014)

Backed changes that increased service, age, and contribution requirements for some public safety and state employees.
